The residue of all my goods Chattels Offitice or offices whatsoever and the whole profit and benefitt of all the articles contracts grants & agreements or of bond or bonds concerning any Offitice or offices or letters Warrants & remapping in my Custody and keeping when I was in perfect health I freely give grant & bequeath unto my said wife in as ample and large manner as I could or should had enjoyed them (if I had lived) And I make and ordaine her sole Executrix of this my last will & Testament in witness whereof the date and year above memoed to the two first pages of this my last will I have subscribed my name and to the latter page thereof I have both subscribed my name and sett my seal in the presence of /

**M**emorandum That upon the first daie of february, in the year of our lord god one thousand five hundred & twenty seven according to the computation of the Church of England, and in the night tyme of the said daie Mr John Walsall abovesaid after his written will was soe fauor yfected as aboue appeareth had conference with his wife Amy Walsall touching the bequeathing of legacies in money, to his three daughters MARYE Elizabeth and Amy, and in that conference said and declared by word of mouth that his will & meaning was that his said daughters Elizabeth and Amy should haue one hundred and fiftie pound apiece in money to be paid to them at theire severall aged of xxj years or daies of theire marriage whiche of them should first happen And that his said daughter MARYE should haue as much in money as either of them demiting fower score pound because she the said MARYE and her husband Bunchy had had soe much already of him in money and moneyworth with said legacie soe given to the said MARYE he said his meaning was should remaine in his wifes hands as he had bymitted in his written will and in thow words or the very like in effect the said testator being of perfect minde and memory, did then expresse and declare to his said wife, his will and meaning to be touching the bequeathing of legacies in money to his said three daughters and not yfected in his written will /

 I Thomas Sadwyn Citizen and Outler of London being at this present in good and perfect health thanked bee therefore rendered to the almighty God, doe make and declare this my will and Testament as followeth First I commend

my soule into the tuition of the holy Trinity assuredly beleeving thorough the merits of Jesus  
Christ the second person in the said Trinity to have free and cleere remission & forgiveness  
of all my sinnes and to bee saved. my body I bequeath to the earth decently to be buried without  
pompe And for such goods Chattells lands and other things whatsoeuer as god hath made mee  
Stewards of in this vale of misery I will and dispose as followeth First that my debts as in any  
wise I shall owe at the tyme of my decease bee truly paid, and order taken for payment of them  
soe soone as maye conveniently bee Item I give and bequeath unto the poore of the parish where  
I am a parishioner the some of fortie shillings to bee paid unto such of the said poore and in such  
quantity as my Executors with the ayde of the Churchwardens shall thinke to have most neede  
Item I give and bequeath to every of my servants wch shall dwell with mee at the tyme  
of my decease the some of ten shillings to bee paid unto them wthin five monthes next after  
my decease Item I forgive unto Daniell Solwall my apprentice the last yeare of his terme  
wch he is to serve mee by his Indenture of apprenticeship Item I give and bequeath to my  
sonne Robert Jadyyn who I praye to besse and reforme the some of five poundes of lawfull  
money of England a feather bed, and such other household stuffe as my Executors shall  
thinke good to give him Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hanna Dunscombe and to  
my daughter Susanna Charrowe to either of them the some of thre poundes to dispose  
of as they please And to bee paid into their own hands (or els not) wthin one yeare next  
after my decease Item I give and bequeath to Jadyyn Dunscombe my daughter Hanna  
her sonne the some of Twentie markes of lawfull money of England to bee paid unto him  
when he shall attaine to the age of Twentie and one yeares Item I give to his brother Phillip  
and Thomas Dunscombe to either of them five poundes of like money to bee paid unto them  
at their said severall ages of Twentie and one yeares And if any of them decease the  
others surviving to have the parte and portion of the deceased And where I am seized and  
possessed to mee and my heires for ever of and in thre severall messuages or tenements  
called or knowne by the severall names of the univorne The Carascus head, and the  
Drowne situate lying and being in the parish of St George in Southwike in the Countie  
of Surrey And wch said messuage or tenement called the Carascus head is divided  
into severall tenements I will and devise the same as followeth Item I give & bequeath  
the said messuages or tenements to Elizabeth my loving wife during her naturall  
life the better to enable her to see my debts paid wch I confidently beleve to her power  
she will see doe And after her the said Elizabeth her decease I give and bequeath the said seve-  
rall messuages or tenements wch their appurtenances to my said Sonne Robert Jady-  
wyn and to the heires of his body lawfully, to bee begotten And for lark of such issue to my  
Daughters Hanna and Susanna and to the heires of their bodies begotten or to bee begotten  
And for default of such issue to the Masters Wardens and Comynalltie of the Butlers of  
London and to their Successors for ever hoping that the said Company will preserve such  
as have beene my servants or otherwise desired from mee, (being capable) of their  
Charthier before any others And that they will alsoe increase the yearly fee or wages  
wch is not now of any sufficiency) to maintayne a man wch shall have not other meane  
to relye upon And where alsoe I have estate and right in and to certayne lands in Virginia  
and in the Sommer Ilands commonly called Bermudes wch lands I will and dispose as  
followeth Item I give and bequeath to my said Sonne Robert Jadyyn and to his heires for-  
ever All my said lands in Virginia, except such lands there as is or shall be allotted to goe  
wch my two Shares in the said Sommer Ilands, wch my will is shall goe wch the said  
Shares as they are or shall be allotted Item I give and bequeath to my Sonne in lawe  
Thomas Dunscombe Hanna his wife Phillip and Thomas their sonnes the same my  
two Shares of land in Sommer Ilands wch the appurtenances To have and to hold  
to them and their Heires Administrators and assignes for ever during the terme of  
one hundred yeares if they or any of them Or any issue from them or any of them shall soe  
long live and dwell and abide in the said Sommer Ilands yielding and paying therof  
yearly only ten poundes waight of Tobarro At the feoff of St Michell the Archangell  
And paying and discharging all other Charges and impositions wch from tyme to tyme

after my decease during the said seasons shall be lawfully taxed and imposed upon the said lands  
 And I ordaine and make the same Elizabeth my wife my full and sole Executrix And I appoint  
 for overseers of this my will the said Master and Wardens of the said Mystery and  
 Confraternity of Butlers of London for that part of of my decease being And I give to and  
 amongst them for their power herein to be taken the same of three pounds of lawfull money  
 of England hoping they will advise my wife in that good sort As the true meaning of this  
 my will may be performed In witness whereof I have hereto sett my hand and seal the  
 fourty daye of November the thousand six hundred twentieth year And in the second  
 year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord Charles by the grace of God King of England  
 Scotland France and Ireland Defender of the Faith &c Thomas Jadygn Witnessed  
 herunto Thomas Coffyn Daniel Colwell.
