

**I**n the name of god amē. The ninth daye of Iulie in the  
yeare of our lord one thousand fynd hundrede þreene score and þyt and in the eighte and  
twentynþe yeare of the reigne of our souerayne Ladie Elizabeth by the grace of god Queenne of England  
France and Irelande defensore of the þayle of þe kyng and þe kyngis sonnes John Duncombe Esquier and marchant taylor  
of London beinge of þe ffeoffes mende and preesse of remembraunce thankes be to Almyghtie god de  
make and declare this my laste wyl and testament in manere and forme followinge that ys to say  
þyselfe and before all thynges I utterly renounce and forsake this wretched world and all the  
waynes pompe and vanities thereof and comitt my selfe whollic to the infinite mecy of Almyghtie  
god my creator and my onely saviour þe þis Christ my culic redemeour and to þe holly gospell my  
sanctys þer acknowledgement þree þersons in one Almyghtie god þerþing him for þe þis Christ has  
take my onely sanȝour to þarden and þeynd me my synde and to take me to his myrrour and that I  
maye be a partaker of his joyes everlastinge etc Item I wyl that my synfull bodie be buryed  
withoute any pompe mayno or superstitious order only I wyl that at my funerall a þrōm be  
preached for the better instrucion of my þroþend and the congregacion then gathered together  
and I beseecheþ to þe þre þersons for þis paynes to be taken at some of þis þyngs and þis  
dynme And I wyl the whole chargis of my funerall to be discharged and done by þe good  
ðerþation of my executors and oþerþors hereafter named Item I wyl that all þis þis debts  
and dutes as þoroþ righte be conþiente to any þerson or þersons he wille and fermeþ  
payde by my Executors hereafter named to the uttermost þemys And after my bodie buried  
my debts þayde and funerall expensis allowed or discharged I wyl that all and  
þingular my goodes cattelis and debtes be divided into þree equall partes accordinge to þe  
lawable custome of þe Cittie of London And þeynd and beseecheþ to þohan my wellbeloved  
wif þe one equall þred þarte of all and singuler my sayd goodes cattelis and debtes to her of

righte beloninges according to the custome of the said cyttie and on chydernall thysde partie of  
all and singuler my said goodes cattles and debtes I leane to my wif belonched and obydent chyldren  
Thomas Empsonne and Elizabeth Empsonne equally betwene hym to be parted and douned and  
to be payde and delynered to hym and cyste of hym in fforment followinge That ys to saye the partie and  
portion of the said Thomas my sonne to be payde to hym at his age of xxiiij years and the partie and  
portion of the sayde Elizabeth my daugther to be payde to her at her age of xvij years  
or at the daye of her mariage whiche of them soone shall fynde and nexte happen after the daye  
date hereof the other chyld partie of all and singuler my said goodes cattles and debtes to come to  
my selfe and my executors therwyl to paye and performe the legacies and blysnges afferm'd herafter  
by me my present laste will and testament conteyned expressed and mentioned Item I gyve and blyngally  
unto the poore honeste shouldeis of the parisshe of Whalley in Lancastre wherof I am a  
parochian the summe of fforment shillings to be payde and distributed too and amongst them immedately  
after my decease by the distrescion of my executors and oneselfe Item I blyngally to the poore honest  
honeste droghtinge wchly parisshe of Sancte Thomas Thaynolle in London Trentho syue  
shillings and eight pence to be delynered to the chyldernarde of the same parisshe within one  
moneth after my decease and to be distributed too and amongst the said poore honeste shouldeis of the  
said parisshe of Sancte Thomas Thaynolle by the distrescion of my selfe blyngal clotheworke  
and pochian cheare Item I gyve and blyngally to the poore prysoneis of the Generall prisone called  
Lindgate Newgate the kyngis banche also Mayfalle, the tress of Spymond and the Fleet in  
and neare the cyttie of London That ys to saye to and amongst the pooreis of ech one of the same  
prisone Trentho shillings to be demed amongst the pooreis of the same prisoneis in chyldre  
sayde prisone by the goddis discrescion of my executors and oneselfe herafter named and to be  
payde within thre moneths nexte after my decease Item I gyve and blyngally unto the Comande  
of Chresten Hospital in the cyttie of London towardes the relouche of the poore chyldren of the  
same hospital the summe of tenne poundes sterlone shillings and pence to be payde to the handes  
of the said godis chyldren within thre moneths after my decease at the said chyldren or the most  
parte of them he at my funerale yf I be buried in London Item I blyngally to the parise of Sancte  
Bartholomew Hospital in Cuntryfylde fforment shillings and to the parise of Sancte Thomas  
Hospital in Sorle marke fforment shillings to be payde and distributed amongst them by the distrescion  
of my executors and oneselfe within thre moneths nexte after my decease Item I gyve and blyngally  
to thre moneths poore men to attende upon my corps on the daye of my funerale Trentho shillings too bee  
readie made of clothe of fforment shillings the yarde at the lochte and to every one of the said chyldren  
poore men if I haue a poore to be payde to them on the daye of my said funerale Item I gyve and blyngally  
too and amongst the poore honeste shouldeis of some fewreall pooreis within the cyttie of London  
wherof the parissheis of Aldermarey Sancte Thomas the Apostle and Sancte Benudt  
Cherchis to be thre of them the summe of tenuis poundis That ys to saye to the poore honeste shouldeis  
of i other one of the same tenuis parissheis to be distributed too and amongst them by the  
distrescion of my executors and oneselfe herafter named within syue moneths nexte after my decease  
Item I blyngally too and amongst the poore and godlie mynisteris and preachers of the wordis  
god within the cyttie of London the summe of tenuis poundes of lawfull money of Englande to be delynered  
and distributed to condicioneis fforment shillings number of xij as by the goddis discrescion of my lerningis Almonde  
and neighe hōis fforment xij of London fforment shalbe thoughte moste needful and comonely within  
one yere nexte after my decease Item I gyve that tenuis poundes sermons to be preached in thre  
parisshe chyrches of Whalleye aforesayde within thre moneths after my decease by trewe  
sermons and godlie and learned preachers to be named and appoynted by the discrescion of my  
executors and oneselfe herafter named whereof Edmonds nome is in thre to be one  
of the preachers That ys to saye in one of the said fforment moneths one of the said sermons to  
be preached And the preachers of the same sermon to haue for his paynes therin taken to him  
shillings parell of the said tenuis poundes Item I doow gyne and blyngally to the master and  
wardens of the worshypfull compaie of the marchamaylord wherof I am a member the summe  
of tenuis poundes of lawfull money of Englande towardes the redyngis and byldinges of the hall

Called the marchant lord hare in London recemengyng that some memorie be made of me in thy  
same hall as thys shall shew god stlmys doore by thys presentes clearnes remyttand forgive  
to my god and rofessioned mother in thys Thomasine Dymcombe my dñe and singuler ffre  
debtis and pnes of money at thys shall over unto me at the tyme of my decess by spesyalis or oþer pnyss  
And if gynt and biquallty unto her lyt sayde Thomasine my mother all and singuler ffre  
cattell oþer oxen hys Bullockes Cheape geldinges and mares whelbunes which shal be ouer to  
to be paytable betwene her and me at the tyme of my decess and hymself and demys to my ffre  
mother Thomasine Dymcombe the rys and occupacion of all and singuler the hyschpudle stufes  
plate and other implemente necessarie and chynges which shal haue at the tyme of my decess  
at or withyn the ffarme or Barke of Dymcombe in the countie of Devon to hysdys and emys  
the same hyschpudle stufes plate and implemente and vnyce parcell therif to be payd  
Thomasine Dymcombe in my natuall life and after her dedeys heire of yns and biquallty  
shysame to my ffre ffre mother Thomasine Dymcombe and her assygnis for ouer hyschpudle  
Dysyngis to my ffre mother that shys royle forset that the same ffre mother dedeys maye pnyss come  
to her handis according to thys my laste wryte and testamente stlmys doore by thys my laste wryte and  
testamente dñe stand biquallty to my ffre mother Thomasine Dymcombe my ffre parcell of the  
sayde Barke of Dymcombe and of the mylles thysurto adiyyngis or beloninge to thys appertinet  
robys of the hyschpudle the oþer thysre parcell for her decess to hysdys the same hyschpudle haþ her  
and her assygnis for and swyngis the tyme of thysre yeres nexte ofter my decess yf thys be  
longe to hys chynges yldingis and payngis therfore yeres during the same learme to my ffre  
or ffre twentys ffe yllmgs and eightys pence at ffre tymeis or whylle ffre astis of thys  
yere that ys to day at the ffreastis of Sancto Michaelis Tharengate the byrdys of our  
Lord god Iannuarij of the blsyd mylde Mary and the natuallitie of Sancto Johanne  
Baptiste by ouer portions And further by her and demys unto my ffre mother Thomasine  
Dymcombe all that my tenementis in thys tyme Acreis of land moore or less thys entitayng  
comyngis callid the ffreastis in the countie of Devon which shal be payd of m<sup>r</sup> Philipp  
Hall esquier too hysdys to her and her assygnis for the tyme of thysre yeres yf thys be  
longe to hys chynges and payngis therfore yeres during the same learme to my ffre  
assygnis syttonys ffe yllmgs at the same tymeis or ffre astis of thysre yeres aboue expressed by  
ouer portions And my mynde and royle ys that my ffre mother during the same tymeis  
tymeis of the promissis abouemonys shal due all maner of apparacis and dñe to be  
done from tyme to tyme upon the same And that shys shall not due or comitt any voluntarie  
waste to the reale of ffe ynes ymmedys upon payngis of ffre ffreastis of her ffre astis to her  
dñe ffre stlmys and biquallty to the same Thomasine my mother and her assygnis  
all that my laste wryte and ffreastis which shal haue in thysre thysre parcell ffre ffreastis which  
shal be payd of m<sup>r</sup> Anthoine Popelane gent in Lydon for tymeis the lufe of the same Anthoine  
the payngis therfore yeres onto him refred for the same item ffe yne and biquallty  
to my ffre mother fyue yardeis of clothe of Thirteene ffe, ringed fforer pent the yarde and one  
one kyngis of ffreastis of the reale of ffreastis ffe yllmgs at the ffreastis And also biquallty to her  
her the sume of twenty punds in monoy to be payd unto her vñ a yerebie after my decess  
be it chyngis Almyghty god to ffre ffreastis ffe longe life and helthe to her glorie and her soule  
helthe Item ffe yne and biquallty unto Elizabeth mynne wifes seruante to my ffre  
mother ffe yne punds in monoy to be payd unto her in thysre one yere nexte after my decess  
yf shys horomayngis dwyngis to my ffre mother at the tyme of my decess Item ffe yne  
and biquallty to one yre one of the monys servantes and mayde seruante which shal be  
dwyngis with my mother at the tyme of my decess a pence to be payd withyn ffe monys  
noþer after my decess And ffe by thys my presentes laste wryte and testamente ffre ffreastis  
forfeyte unto my seruante Edward Gwyngis all such debts dutes and demandes as he  
dyd owe unto me or wherof he was to wnde me anye accoupte before thys ffreastis of thys  
natuallitie of Sancto Johanne Baptiste whiche was in the yere of our Lord god 1533  
for all debtes dutis and demandes syttonys the same ffreastis ffre ffreastis ffre ffreastis

Anneswable and tenuit acempte for the same to my exentor horecoster named according to the  
truste of hand in him and for his deuote to be quenatherto unto hym the said Edward vij to viij<sup>o</sup>  
of larefull money of englande to be payde unto hym in one year after my decease, also to be quenatherto to the  
said Edward three yards & xl of clothe of vij a yard to make hym a clake, Item, ffor clerke robes and  
foryne unto my nebelonod brother walter Dinscombe all and singuler such debites and somes of  
money as he shall owe unto me at the tyme of my decease by specialite or otherwise And to be quenatherto  
to the said walter Dinscombe vij pounds of larefull money of englande to be payde unto hym  
vij in three years nexte after my decease vij yards of clothe vij a yard and my Item, ffor gynne and  
be quenatherto to my said brother walter Dinscombe one ringe of golde worthie xl s. And also by  
yards of clothe of vij a yard to make a clake for hym selfe and a gorne for Elynor his  
wife And ffor gynne and be quenatherto to the said Elynor Dinscombe and to Anna her daughter the sume  
of vij a yard to be payde to them by equall portions within vij monthes nexte after my decease  
Item, ffor gynne and be quenatherto to my nebelonod brother Robert Dinscombe the sume of xxiiij  
pounds of larefull money of englande and to my sister Marye Dinscombe his wife vij pounds  
and vij s. And to their somes my nephewes Elynor Dinscombe vij a yard and vij s. whiche said  
three laste funeralles to be quenatherto to the sume of xvij to xvj and my ffor gynne shall be deducted  
unto hym oule of such debites as the said Robert Dinscombe shall owe unto me at the tyme of my  
decease and he to amsware and paye to hym said somes Elynor the said legacie to hym be quenatherto  
And I wyl that the said Robert Dinscombe my brother shall paye unto my exentor horecoster  
named all such debites as he shall owe unto me at the tyme of my death (the said Edward vij to  
vij s and my ffor gynne deducted) by two hundred poundes a year and every by po monthes  
one of the vntill the same be payde And shall enter into bande with me to paye to my exentor for the  
payement of the same at the tyme of my decease And then my exentor shall paye to hym the  
least of his dwelinge house at Exon whiche I have for my servite, monys to maymeyn in my  
dwelinge house at Dinscombe Bariton and also ffor gynne to the said Robert Dinscombe a ringe  
of golde worthie xl s and vij yards of clothe of vij a yard to make a gorne for hym selfe a  
gorne for his wife and a coat for the said Elynor Dinscombe Item, ffor gynne and be quenatherto to my  
nebelonod brother Thomas Dinscombe the sume of xxiiij pounds of larefull money of englande  
to be payde to him in two years nexte after my decease vij a yard to him also vij yards the same  
he payde And I be quenatherto unto my said brother Thomas a ringe of golde worthie xl s and  
vij yards of clothe of vij a yard to make hym a gorne and a coat Item, ffor gynne and be quenatherto  
unto my nebelonod kynman m. John Cromebridge of Lyton Esquire a ringe of golde  
xxij poyntis ffor gynne and vij yards of clothe of vij a yard to make gornes for  
him and my cosyn Marye his wife Item, ffor gynne unto my sonn George Cromebridge vij  
yards of clothe of vij a yard to make gornes for hym and his wife And I be quenatherto to  
Marye Cromebridge his wife of my sonn Will of Lyton thre yards of clothe of vij a yard  
to make her a gorne Item, ffor gynne unto the poacher monsorpound for Lyton xl s in monys  
to be payde to hym in one year nexte after my decease vij a quartre to the same by the said  
do poacher ffowrd sonnall semond in the parochie churche of Lyton where he shal dwelle with him  
one yeare nexte after my decease at the appointment and distretcion of the said m. John  
Cromebridge Item, ffor gynne unto the poore honest boulders and inhabitantes of the towne  
and parochie of Lyton exceppe stede in vij a virg to be demded and distributed to and amongest  
them by the good distretcion of the said m. John Cromebridge in thre monthes nexte after my  
decease Item, ffor gynne and be quenatherto my land demy by this my laste wyl and testamente to  
the tenuit gornors and corporacion of the churche and parochie of kyfford alde Brodyston in the  
said countie of Denon and to their successors for ever or by what seueraynt and or addicon theri  
be knowne or called one myghter year old vij yards of clothe of vij a yard to make gornes and vij  
pence of larefull money of englande to be payde to the poacher ffowrd sonnall semond in the  
countie of Denon with the full power and  
authorite to strayne for the same And my wyl mynde and intente yd that the said  
amythio of ij to vij a virg to be by the said tenuit gornors and their successors for ever employed

And beseeched in manner and forme hereafter expressed and mentioned, That ye saye that the sayd  
trewe gevernor or corporacion of the parochie of Lytton aforesaid for the tyme beinge shall be enorgo-  
soned recouered for endrat and rehylle the parochie churche of Lytton aforesaid to be deylyned les-  
trewe person oris in pawardien and appoynt myndes of the same parochie of Lytton to be thyn and  
appoynted by the said trewe gevernor or corporacion for the tyme beinge trewe parysche churche white leves  
of breake vyz. to each of them one pence leves for that none that hath amyngynge to the realme of Eng-  
yllande a year to lyne and shall haue or receyved any partie of the same breake And I myl that  
the said trewe parysche churche be deylyned to the said trewe pawardien with the parochie churche  
of Lytton aforesaid after service done in the ffornond of every sabbath messe at the parochie churche  
of Lytton aforesaid And hat the trewe crete cheare for the tyme beinge once monthe  
quater of a year at thondrelynes of the same breake shall paye offe vij pence per pawardien (every imge the  
same) in mynde of thys dencys exhortinge them to gyve and leavens gyng to Almyghty god  
that hathe so well promide for hem and al other dencys shall exhorte them whiche oþer appon  
the Lordes praye it the tyme comandementes of Almyghty god And that chelde of the churche transfaile  
and to kyne whether thys amysse or undestand the same or not and for his paynes therin levetation  
I wyl that the said Antor or Create for the tyme beinge shall haue and receyve at the handes of the said  
gevernor or Corporacion of Lytton aforesaid the sume or expayne of six shillinges and eighte pence  
per pawardien of the said Almyghty god vj d and vij d to be payd to hym and his successours Antor or Create  
theras for the tyme beinge yeaþles for endrat the sume falle of the year alone expayned  
by enen pawardien And the residue of the said Almyghty god vj d and vij d to be beslowed to the Antor  
per pawardien of the same parochie of Lytton by the discrecion of the said trewe gevernor or Corporacion  
of Lytton aforesaid for the tyme beinge or sume of hym from tyme to tyme for enor from tyme to tyme  
be knownþ to the said vj d gevernor or Corporacion of Lytton aforesaid the sume of one hundred þre  
markes of lawfull money of englande to be payd to the said vj d gevernor or Corporacion for the tyme  
beinge in manner and forme followinge That ye to saye theras three þre pawardien ffor shillinges and  
eighte pence therof with in one year after my decease And that the said gevernor or corporacion appon  
the receipt therof do become bounde by obligacion in due forme to be made and sealed with þyre comon  
seale under the sume or penallie of þre þre pawardien to the said Thomas Duncombe my sonne to deylyne  
the said sume of vj d and vij d in þre montþes nexte after thys shall haue receyved  
the same to þyne honest pore men campyng and inhabitanþ nexte in the torno and Berton  
of Lytton aforesaid by enen pawardien vyz to enry man vj d and vij d and ther and enore of them  
to haue the aþend occupacion theron in free laune for and durenge the tyme and space of þre years  
then nexte followinge theron and enore of them puttinge insufficent swete or frawne unto the said  
vij d gevernor or Corporacion of Lytton aforesaid for the tyme beinge for the þre and tƿe repayment  
of enry þre þre pawardien and vij d þeo to be deylyned in free laune at the ende of enere þre years  
unto the said trewe gevernor or their successors for the tyme beinge And the said vj d gevernor for  
the tyme beinge to deylyne the said sume of vj d and vij d to other þyne person of the torno  
and Berton of Lytton aforesaid for other þre years appon hys mortis or parentis and for  
the said free laune of the said vj d and vij d to haue contynuance from þre years to  
þre years forwars And the other vj d and vij d to syden of the said one hundred þre markes  
I myl to be payd to the said vj d gevernor or Corporacion for the tyme beinge at the end of þre years  
nexte after my decease see that there entor into aþe laune of þre þre pawardien vj d and vij d to the  
said Thomas Duncombe appon þyre receipt therof to deylyne the said þre þre pawardien to þe  
þre montþes nexte after thys shall haue receyved þe same to other þyne honest pore men beinge in  
campyng and inhabitanþ of the Torno and Berton of Lytton aforesaid by enen pawardien vyz  
the enore of them vj d and vij d and ther and enore of them to haue the aþend occupacion  
theron in þre þre montþes aþerward for and durenge the tyme and space of þre years appon  
þe hys mortis or parentis to be put into the said vj d gevernor for the tyme beinge  
for the þre and tƿe repayment þe rest at the end of the said þre years as before ye limited and  
expayned for repayment of the said þre þre pawardien vj d and vij d þeo of the said one hundred þre  
markes of the said vj d gevernor for the tyme beinge from tyme to tyme to deylyne the said þre þre pawardien  
vj d and vij d to syden of the said sume of one hundred þre markes to other þyne honest pore men beinge in

occupiers and inhabitants within the towne or burroughes of Lytton aforesaid for the bearing of other  
fyne yeres upon such as he shalles or pame as before ydement hymited were proffed, and so the  
said ffrede leane of the said laste wylle is to my said wyf, residens of the said ffrede of one hundred too  
hant contynuallnes from fyne yeres to fyne yeres for ever according to the tyme intime and meaneing  
of this my present laste wylle and Testament I willed alwayes and my wylle mynd and wylle yd  
that that man whiche once shall haue had the bounchyt of this my wylle and Testamente therof and  
occupacion of any yere wthyn dñe and my partell of the said ffrede of one hundred for and during the thre  
spates and termes of fyne yeres as ydement shall haue afterwardes haue the same or  
and lyke partell of the said ffrede of one hundred in spate or occupation againe for another tyme setynge  
what soner when theare yd any other in the said parcell he melle to haue and occupie the same as  
according to the tyme and tyme meaneing of this my laste wylle and testament And further my  
wylle and mynde yd that clothed and unclod shalbe preferred to haue his occupacion and  
bonchyt of the said ffrede of one hundred the melle to and ondyng partell therof before any other yere  
or per sonde what soner Item of fyne and beynallye to my lounche brother in lawe Thomas Alderwyll  
marchantay for a kyng of gouldes worth the ffte of fyndynges and sufficient clothe of vij dñe  
the yarde to make hym and his wif cythe of thom a gorne and fij gyno and beynallye to my brother in  
lawn John Ayle a kyng of gouldes worth yle and to my sister in lawn Alice Ayle his wif for a  
kyng of gouldes worth yle at the lesse Item of beynallye unto my Nephew Thomas Ayle  
some of the saidde John Ayle vij dñe and my to be payde to hym when he shall come to the age  
of trentie and fforer yeres / Also fij fyndynges to the saidde John Ayle and his wif so muche  
clothe of vij dñe yarde as wylle make cythe of thom a gorne Item fij gyno and beynallye unto my  
brother in lare Roberte Alderwyll a kyng of gouldes worth yle and fij gyno unto my suster Helyne  
Alderwyll his wif the same of ffte of fyndynges and to enclos one of her chldren to a pece to be  
payde in thre yeres or neyle after my decess Also fdo fyno unto my said brother Roberte Alderwyll  
and his wif so muche clothe of vij dñe yarde as wylle make cythe of thom a gorne fij gyno and beynallye unto my brother in lare Symon Alderwyll a kyng of gouldes worth yle  
and so muche clothe as wylle make hym and his wif cythe of thom a gorne  
Item combe a kyng of gouldes worth yle pomed fij fyndynges and eighte pence and fdo  
gyno unto my suster Margaret Symcombe his wif one kyng of gouldes worth yle Also fdo  
gyno unto my sayde brother George Symcombe se muche clothe as wylle make hym and my suster  
Margaret his wif cythe of thom a gorne of vij dñe yarde at the leaste And to his sone George  
Symcombe a blacke coote of the same clothe Item fij gyno and beynallye unto my mellelonded  
brother synger Symcombe a kyng of gouldes worth yle pomed fij dñe and fij gyno unto  
my mellelonded suster Grace his wif one kyng of gouldes worth yle ffor the fyndynges and to his  
sonnes John Symcombe and Thomas Symcombe each of thom a blacke coote of the same pece and  
to his daughter Mary Symcombe a blacke gorne of the same pece Also fij gyno unto my said  
brother synger Symcombe and his wif se muche clothe as wylle make hym a gorne of vij  
lyme pomed in monoy to be payde to him whole yare nexte after my decess and so  
muche clothe as wylle make hym a gorne of vij dñe yarde And fdo fyno unto wylm Robynson  
his sonne thre componeys ffor the fyndynges and eighte pence to be payde unto him whiche best all come  
to the age of xvi yeres yf he shall so longe lyve And fdo fyno deme and beynallye unto thys  
sayde Loare Robynson and unto wylm Robynson his sonne dwynghe thys nativall byrd and thys  
longest lynghe of them All that my fleare mo or Barons of Colridge my Thappelme and bynges  
with in the combe of Devyn nor in the plomme or occupacion of m Agustine Stewkley whiche  
houldeth the same for tyme of his life so that uppou the death of synder or for sonnes of the said  
Agustine Stewkley the said Loare Robynson and wylm Robynson his sonne ar to ente and a
