first day of february in the yeare of our lord god one thousand five hundreth
 twentie seven according to the computacion of the church of England, and in
 the night tyme of the said day Mr John Wallall abovenamed after his written
 will was so faire yfert as above apparetly had conseruacione with his wif Amy Wallall
 touching the bequacis of legaries in money to his thre daughters Wylgefors Elizabeth
 and Amy and in that conseruacione said and declared by word of mouth that his will & meaning
 was that his said daughters Elizabeth and Amy shold haue one hundred and fifti poundes apiece
 in money to be paid to them at thire severall ages of vii yeare or daies of their marriage
 with of them shold first happen And that his said daughter Wylgefors shold haue as much in
 money as either of them deuoitly fower stoke poundes because she the said Wylgefors and her
 husband Buncy had had so much already of him in money and monty worth with said
 legarie so givien to the said Wylgefors he said his meaning was shold remaine in his wifes
 hands as he had hymt in his written will and in thos words or the very like in effect
 the said testator being of ffrete minde and memory did then expresse and declare to his
 said wif his will and meaning to be touching the bequacis of legaries in money to
 his said thre Daughters and not yfert in his written will /

 good and perfect health thanked be therefore rendred to the almighty God do
 make and declare this my will and testament as followeth First I command

Thomas
 Sadwyn -

my soule into the tutour of the holy spirit assyndly becommyngh thorowgh the meyrifts of Iesu
Christ the second person in the said toun to haue free and cleare remission & forgyuenes -
of all my synnes and to bee launced my body to bequeath to the earth decently to be buried without
pomp And for such good chattle lande and other things whatsoeuer god hath made me &
Item I shall in this bale of mynnes I will and dispose as followeth first that my debts ad in my
wifte I shall owe at the tyme of my dorecas be truly paid and order taken for payment of them
soone as may conueniently bee Item I give and bequeath unto the poore of the parish where
I am a gyssioner the summe of xii shillings to bee paid unto sum of the said poore and in my
quantite as my Executor with the ayde of the Churchewardens shall think to haue most neede -
Item I give and bequeath to every of my servantes whiche shalbe dwytching wth me at the tyme
of my decease the summe of ten shillings to bee paid unto them within syx monthe next after
my decease Item I forgyne unto Daniell Holwall my appenture the last year of his tyme
whiche he is to serue me by his indenture of appentishood Item I give and bequeath to my
sonne Robert Fadwyn who I praye to blesse and reforme the summe of ffe younds of lawfull
money of Englaund a ffetherbed and such other household stuffe ad my Experiture shall -
haue good to gye him Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hanna Dunscombe and to
my daughter Susanna Charonne to either of them the summe of thre pounds to dispose
of as they please And to bee paid into their owne hands (or else not) whiche ouer yeare next
after my decease Item I give and bequeath to Fadwyn Dunscombe my daughter Hanna
her summe the summe of Twentie markes of lawfull money of Englaund to bee paid unto him
when he shall attaine to the age of Twentie and one yarde Item I give to his brother Phillip
and Thomas Dunscombe to either of them ffe pounds of like money to bee paid unto them
at thire said severall ages of Twentie and one yarde And if any of them decease the o -
ther(s) surviving to haue the parte and porcion of the deceased And where I am seized and
possessest to mee and my heires for ever of and in thire severall messuages or tenementis
called or knowne by the severall names of the uniuorne The Savasens head and the -
Dowmunt Strueete lying and being in the parish of St George in Southwiche in the Countie
of Surrey And in the said messuage or tenement called the Savasens head is deuided -
into severall tenementis I will and devise the same as followeth Item I give & bequeath
the said messuages or tenementis to Elizabeth my louing wif during her naturall -
life the better to enable her to set my debts paid wth I confidently beleue to her power
she will so doe And after her decease I give and bequeath the said seve -
rall messuages or tenementis wth their appurtenances to my said sonne Robert Fad -
wyn and to his heires of his body lawfullly to bee begotten And for lacke of sume issue to my
Daughter Hanna and Susanna and to his heires of heire bodys begotten or to bee begotten
And for default of sume issue to the Master Wardens and Commonallitie of the Butlers of
London and to their successours for ente hoping that the said Company will preferre sume
ad haue beent my servantes or otherwise desydred from me (being capable) of heire -
ship before any other(s) And that they will affre entreas the yearly fee or wages
wch is not now of any sufficiencie to maintayne a man wth shalbe haue not other meane
to rely vpon And where affre I haue estate and right in and to certeyne lands in Virginea
and in the Sommer Islands commonly called Bermudas wth lands I will and dispose as -
followeth Item I give and bequeath to my said sonne Robert Fadwyn and to his heires for
ever All my said lands in Virginea except sume lands theras id or shalbe allotted to goe -
wth my two shires in the said Sommer Islands wth my will wch shall goe wth the said
shires as they are or shalbe allotted Item I give and bequeath to my sonne in lawe -
Thomas Dunscombe Hanna his wife Phillip and Thomas their sonnes the same my
two shires of land in Sommer Islands wth the appurtenances to haue and to hould
to them and their descendentes Administratores and assignees for me during the tyme of
one hundred years if they or any of them or any issue from them or any of them shall so -
longe haue and dwelle and abide in the said Sommer Islands dwelling and payng therfore
yearly unto ten poundes weight of Cobarro At the stafe of St Michael the Archangell
And payng and discharging all other shaires and impositions wth from tyme to tyme

after my decease during the said termes shall be lawfully had and imposed upon the said land
And I warrant and make the same Elizabeth my wife my full and sole Executrix And I appoint
for executors altho' my will be said Master and Wardens of the said Mystery and
Commonallie of Cuntry of London for that year of my decease being And I give to and
amongst them for the same cause herem to be taken the sume of thre pounds of lawfull money
of Englaund by whom they will aduise my wife in that good sort As thereto meaning of this
and will maie bee performed In witness whereof I haue here to sett my hand and seal the
fourteyn day of November Anno thousand five hundred & sixtie five And in the second
yeare of the reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles by the grace of God King of Englaund
Scotland ffraunce and Irelond Defendor of the faith by Thomas Jardogn witnessed
